


Celebrate the Seasons: Around the World Date: November 30, 12:00 to 4:00 PM

We held a soft launch of Island Voices in early August!

We've launched with three videos, the first is a discussion with Jeanette Lloyd and Martha Kremer reflecting on growing up in Ship Bottom. They regale us with their stories and their

friendship.

The second video is Kris Anderson, the last of the Pound Fisherman who goes into great detail on the life of pound fisherman on the island, along with some of his adventures as a life-long resident.

The third video is of Suzette Whiting, former President of the LBIHA and a long-time owner of the famous Holiday Snack Bar in Beach Haven. Come hear Suzette tell the story of the "happy mistake" that is the beloved Lady Lord Baltimore cake.

We will be adding new videos to Island Voices by the end of the year.

Another project is underway to digitize and release dozens of hours of audio tapes of historians, authors and long-time residents telling their stories of LBI in the form of Porch Rocker Talks which were held in the 1970s, 1980s, 1990s and early 2000s on our own museum porch. These recorded talks are hidden treasures that we are excited to bring to a whole new audience in a new medium next year. Keep an eye out for Porch Rocker Talks from the LBIHA soon.



This summer we featured an exhibit titled **Celebrating Summer Fun 1950-1980** prominently in the museum. Here, our museum visitors could explore the nostalgia and memories of this iconic era with our new multimedia narratives. We are now extending the opportunity to view this exhibit online on our website. Simply click on **VIDEO** to watch this 10-minute movie.

We have several new artifacts that were donated to the museum this year, but particularly notable is a quilt donated by Wendy Ingersoll Perry, granddaughter of Louisa Browning, who was the daughter-in-law of Archelaus Pharo, the founding father of Beach Haven. The family names that are sewn onto this quilt serve as a tapestry of family lineage that go back as far as 1843 and demonstrate the deep connection between Tuckerton, West Creek, Philadelphia, and Beach Haven. The quilt will be on display next year.

Another important artifact is an organ from 1870 that was owned by Capt. John Tilton Fox, the owner of the Hotel deCrab in Beach Haven. Capt. Fox was a schooner captain who was originally from Waretown. That specific exhibit is on display in the parlor in the museum.
